Benefits to Recycling

- reduced supply and material expenses
- reduced waste collection and disposal costs
- improved image within the community
- increased employee pride in their workplace
- a positive impact on the environment

HOW? – Create a Strategy

- 1. Conduct a waste assessment
- 2. Identify waste reduction opportunities
- 3. Establish a baseline and measurement strategy
- 4. Set reduction goals
- 5. Make it easy!!!
- 6. Educate!!!



Reduce & Reuse

- Print on both sides of paper
- Use ink cartridges until they actually run out
- Save packaging materials for reuse
- Turn Tyvek envelopes inside-out and reuse
- Avoid over-packaged items
- Sell or donate usable items (furnishings, office equipment, appliances, etc.)



Make it Easy!



- Identify waste items that can be recycled
- Provide convenient & clearly marked containers for each waste category
- Remove regularly

- Office paper: mixed vs. white only
- Newspaper
- Cardboard
- Pressboard
- Magazines
- Phone books
- Books

Scrap Metal



- Cans steel and aluminum
- Aluminum scrap
- Steel scrap
- Appliances (with freon removed)

- Adverse effects to workers, animals, plants, air, water, soil
- Toxic material content
- Packaging
- Transportation
